- 1. Please SIGN UP an account or SIGN IN if you have already registered on the webshop using the link https://caxtonbooks.snapplify.com/. Do not create a new user name and password if you already use the Snapplify system e.g. Wynberg Boys High School, use the user name and password you already have.
- 2. Always use the same USERNAME and PASSWORD for your eReader app and the webshop. DO NOT LEAVE ANY SPACES IN YOUR USERNAME.
- 3. **If you do not have a voucher code** Search for the item(s) you require, add them to your shopping cart, confirm your selection and process your credit card payment (Master Card, Amex or Visa currently accepted). You may also pay by EFT using the bank details on the website but you must email proof of payment to orders@snapplify.com so that we confirm payment and release your books.
- 4. **If you have a voucher code** Select REDEEM VOUCHER, enter your voucher code and <u>check</u> that the correct books are on the voucher. Select redeem. ENSURE THAT YOU HAVE A VOUCHER PER CHILD. Do not redeem your voucher if this is not the case.
- 5. YOUR VOUCHER IS ONLY REDEEMABLE ONCE and then the books on it will be forever associated with your account based on the USERNAME and PASSWORD selected above.
- 6. Go to your App Store (iOS or Android) on your reading device and download the Snapplify Reader which is free of charge (search for Snapplify). If you are using a Windows, MAC or Chrome operating system go to http://getsnapplify.com/.
- 7. Log in to the downloaded reading app on your device by using the same user name and password that you used in the webshop to redeem the voucher or purchase books.
- 8. Your purchased books will be in your library, select each book to download it to your device. Ensure that you are connected to the internet with a cable or have a good wi-fi signal when you begin your download. Download one book at a time.
- 9. Please note that vouchers must be redeemed within 10 days of issue and are charged by the publisher(s) on issue date and not redemption date and cannot be returned.

POWERS AND FUNCTIONS OF THE LEARNER REPRESENTATIVE COUNCIL AT GLEN AUSTIN HIGH SCHOOL

- 1. The LRC, as a highest body of elected leaders of the learners of the school, must
- (a) promote the best interest and welfare of the school and its learners;
- (b) liase between learners and the school management;
- (c) with approval of the principal, undertake projects and programmes aimed at
- (i) improving and maintaining the school environment and facilities;
- (ii) providing cultural, sport and social activities for learners; and
- (iii) improving the health and welfare of learners;
- (d) assist the principal and teachers to ensure adherence to the code of conduct of the school by all learners so as to create and maintain an orderly and disciplined school environment conducive to learning; and
- (e) perform any other reasonable tasks assigned to the LRC by the principal and educators.
- 2. The LRC may with the approval of the principal and educators establish committees for specific functions or projects of the LRC.

ENGLISH EDITORIAL

English: "Anonymous writer"

1. Read as much as you can

Just as we say that listening is closely related to speaking, reading is closely related to writing so our number 1 tip for improving your English writing would be to **read as much as you can!** This will help you improve your vocabulary, grammar, sentence structure, and show you there are many different ways to communicate ideas. For example: If you need to write a description of a house or a bio of yourself, a great idea is to read some other bios or house descriptions, from books, magazines, brochures, the internet or whatever source you can think of. After having read others, then you can attempt to write your own.

2. Keep an English dictionary

You'll be able to look up words to clarify their meaning and to learn antonyms and synonyms so as not to repeat words or phrases, which will better your communication skills.

3. Brush up your grammar

Even though you don't have to "study" grammar, your English writing will improve a lot if you work on grammar exercises. Also, remember that grammar is more important when you write than when you speak because it is usually more formal and more structured.

4. Check your spelling before and after writing

How do you feel when you read something full of spelling mistakes in your own language? Poor spelling can spoil an otherwise interesting piece to read, and we generally write for other people to read what we've written.

5. Keep a diary in EnglishIt will make you write every day to turn writing into a routine activity. Besides, you are "writing to yourself", which can make you feel liberated and satisfied.

You don't need to write elaborate sentences: you can keep them as simple as you want.

6. Learn how to expand your basic sentences into more elaborate ones

There are five basic sentence structures in English:

- Subject Verb (John studies; My friend is playing)
- Subject Verb Object (I like apples; Mary reads novels)
- Subject Verb Adverb (She speaks fluently; These flowers are everywhere)
- Subject Verb Noun (My father was a chemist, You are a student)
- Subject -Verb Adjective (Jenny is happy; Linda is pretty)

7. Learn how to organize a paragraph

An useful way to improve your English writing skills is to start your paragraphs with a **topic sentence**: i.e. a sentence that explains what you are going to write about. Continue with **supporting sentences**: i.e. sentences that provide more information about the topic. Finish with a **conclusion**: i.e. it is generally a summary of the ideas developed in the body of the paragraph. **Learn how to make transitions** between paragraphs to signal relationships between ideas so as to create a fluent body of text.

8. Write an outline

Even in a very simple piece of English writing you have to keep some kind of an organization to convey the message you want in a clear orderly way. There are many different ways to write outlines and these have much to do with the way you organize things in your mind.
